# ATTRACTIONS

## MANASSAS MUSEUM

The Manassas Museum recently reopened after a major renovation of their facility. New galleries feature long term exhibitions with changing stories around the following themes: Transportation, Native Americans, War, People and Places, and Entertainment. Hands on experiences allow visitors to engage with these exhibits in multiple ways. A short-term changing exhibition gallery provides two to three different displays each year including *Artistic Expression*, the annual student art show presented in partnership with Osbourn High School. A brand-new Manassas Timeline exhibition provides a sweeping overview of local history, set within the context of state and national history. After visiting the galleries, pick up a gift or souvenir in Echoes, the Manassas Museum Store, located adjacent to the main lobby.

New spaces in the museum include The Joann Bagnerise Family History and Education Center where you can research your family history or enjoy a special program; the Mae Merchant Exhibit Hall, with floor to ceiling glass walls that provide sweeping views of the museum lawn and downtown area, and a large outdoor courtyard that is the perfect place to relax after your visit or enjoy one of the many events that take place on the museum lawn. ## ANNABURG

Built in 1892 as a summer home by multi-millionaire businessman Robert Portner, this building was acquired by the City in 2019. The house is currently closed while undergoing work to stabilize and renovate the structure. The 3.6 acres that surround the home are open daily from dawn to dusk for visitors to enjoy. Be sure to check out the foundations of an old stone tower that once stood on the property, which were only recently uncovered during archaeological investigations of the lawn. ## MAYFIELD AND CANNON BRANCH EARTHWORK FORTS

Be sure to see two Civil War earthwork forts—all that's left from over a dozen that once dotted the local landscape. The 1861 Mayfield Fort was built by enslaved workers and Confederate forces to defend the junction of the Manassas Gap and Orange and Alexandria Railroads. Today, the fort is still the highest natural elevation in Manassas and features interpretive panels, reproduction cannon, and the Hooe Family Cemetery. Walk through shady Cannon Branch Fort, built in 1864 by Union troops, and check out the remaining fort walls. Benches provide a place to rest and enjoy the quiet, park-like setting. If you are lucky, you may even catch a glimpse of a pair of bald eagles that make this historic site their home. Both forts are open for free from dawn to dusk. ## LIBERIA

In 1825, Harriett Bladen Mitchell Weir and her husband, William James Weir, built the house that became known as Liberia. Situated on 1,660 acres the plantation was worked by 80 enslaved persons making it one of the largest and most successful in western Prince William County. During the Civil War, Liberia served as headquarters for both Union and Confederate armies. Union soldiers stationed in and around Manassas from 1862–1864 left behind their signatures, drawings, and other writings on the second floor of the home. It's believed that both President Abraham Lincoln and Confederate President, Jefferson Davis, visited the house during the war. The City acquired the property in 1986. Since that time, the house has undergone major renovations to stabilize the structure and return it to its pre-Civil War appearance. While the house is not open on a daily basis, tours and programs are offered on occasion. Private tours are also given upon request. The grounds, garden, and trails are open daily from dawn to dusk. ## MANASSAS INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL / JENNIE DEAN MEMORIAL

Visit the Manassas Industrial School/Jennie Dean Memorial to learn more about the school's charismatic founder and walk the grounds of the original campus that was a national model for African American vocational and academic education. A bronze statue is the focal point of a memorial plaza where you can reflect and read interpretive signage. Despite being born into slavery in 1852 and without the benefit of a formal education, Jennie Dean's vision changed the lives of countless African Americans in the region during the dark days of segregation. While working as a domestic in Washington, DC, she raised enough funds from prominent East Coast philanthropists to establish the Manassas Industrial School for Colored Youth. ## MANASSAS NATIONAL BATTLEFIELD PARK

Not far from downtown are the hallowed acres that made the name Manassas synonymous with bravery, sacrifice, and symbolic of the tragedy and futility of war. Walk this rolling, peaceful countryside and partake of the legend and mystery that the Manassas National Battlefield Park still holds. A key crossroads during the American Civil War, today the City of Manassas is a thriving railroad city proud of its unique heritage and vibrant downtown.

Within the park there are Civil War-era structures, commemorative monuments, artillery emplacements, and historic view sheds that soldiers who fought here in 1861 and 1862 would recognize. Guided walking tours are offered for groups who make advance reservations. Living history demonstrations are provided throughout the year on weekends. ## THE SOUTHERN RAILWAY DEPOT

A part of the Manassas Museum System, this building now serves as the City's Visitor Center. It is also home to the James and Marion Payne Railroad Heritage Gallery, featuring an exhibit installed by the Museum that looks at the history and impact on the railroad on Manassas. Built in 1914, the depot is the signature icon of Historic Downtown. A working train station and home to the offices of Historic Manassas, Inc., a Virginia Main Street organization, the depot is a busy stop for daily Amtrak and Virginia Railway Express (VRE) commuter trains. VRE connects commuters and visitors with Washington, DC while the Amtrak line runs from Lynchburg through Manassas and connects the City to the entire country by rail.

The Historic Manassas Visitor Center is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. and is only closed New Year's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. The friendly, knowledgeable staff in our Visitor Center offers brochures, maps, and advice to help make the most of your visit to Manassas. Accommodation information can also be sent to your home. ## ARTS

The City of Manassas has caught the "Art Bug" with little bits of art popping up in and around Historic Downtown. Wonderful galleries, art hung in Downtown establishments, art events, and amazing outdoor sculptures are here for you to celebrate the arts.

### ARTFACTORY

This community art center is located in the historic 1908 Hopkins Candy Factory building. Over the years this commercial building saw many different uses from operating as a Southern States store to a tire warehouse. After the City of Manassas

obtained the property, extensive restoration and repair of the building took place. Today, the old Hopkins Candy Factory houses exhibit space, classrooms, and a performing arts theater. A small exhibit on the history of the building is located in the second-floor lobby. The first-floor gallery and reception area are open to the public Monday – Friday from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. and on Saturdays from 1 p.m. – 5 p.m. Stop in to view the historic structure, rotating art shows, and exhibits—admission is free. ### HYLTON PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Dedicated to bringing a world-class performing arts venue to the Prince William region, the Hylton Performing Arts Center was born out of a partnership among Prince William County, George Mason University, the City of Manassas, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and individuals and businesses in the private sector. Soaring more than nine stories and boasting a stunning mix of copper, glass, and masonry, the 102,000-square foot center is home to two unparalleled performance venues for local arts groups and performers from around the world, as well as university-related activities. The Hylton Center Education and Rehearsal Wing opened in December 2019—adding 17,000 square feet of space for rehearsals, classes, and performances, and allows the artists and arts educators of our community to fully facilitate the entire life-cycle of artistic creation. A Mason Arts venue, the Hylton Performing Arts Center is managed by Mason's College of Visual and Performing Arts. The only building of its kind in the area, the Hylton Center has quickly become the cultural hub of Prince William County and the surrounding communities and is a shining example of civic collaboration and commitment to the arts.



### OPEN AIR ART

Historic Downtown is fortunate to boast four amazing galleries within walking distance of each other. Take a stroll and view art as you travel from one gallery to another. On the historically themed light poles, you'll find original artwork transformed into street banners, and may also spot a utility box painted to look like a fish tank or electric plugs imitating colorful bugs. Whether you prefer sculpture and murals or painted trains featuring whimsical art like Van Gogh's *Starry Night*, new art is always popping up and every trip is an artful experience. ## FIRST FRIDAYS

### FEBRUARY THROUGH DECEMBER

Historic Downtown celebrates First Fridays February through December. Manassas closes the streets in the early evening and Downtown becomes an even more pedestrian-friendly environment. The specialty stores stay open late for you to enjoy shopping and browsing their unique inventories. Each First Friday features a different theme, making it a wonderful time to visit Downtown.

## ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

### MARCH EVENT

Saint Patrick's Day has come to be associated with everything Irish: Green and gold, shamrocks, and luck. The parade features traditional Irish dancers, bagpipes, bands, and kilts. After the parade, you can settle into one of our Downtown restaurants or breweries and join locals to celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick.

### SPRING EVENT

## HISTORIC MANASSAS FARMERS MARKET

### APRIL TO NOVEMBER

Named the 2023 Best Farmers Market in Prince William County by InsideNova and recognized as the Best Farmers Market in Northern Virginia by *Virginia Living Magazine*, the Historic Manassas Farmers Market proudly serves the local community and visitors on Thursdays and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The Thursday Market is held at the Harris Pavilion at 9201 Center Street and is strictly for vendors within a 200-mile radius of Manassas that sell locally grown produce and handmade/homemade products. The Saturday Market is hosted at the Commuter Parking Lot located at 9024 Prince William Street and is open to non-producers who purchase products from an authorized food source or wholesaler. The Saturday Market runs through November, while the Thursday Market ends in October.

## MANASSAS VIKING FESTIVAL

### MAY EVENT

Celebrate all things Viking! This family-friendly festival includes entertainment, music, dancers, reenactments, and educational demonstrations about Vikings who were explorers, raiders, pirates, and colonizers during the Middle Ages (9th to 11th centuries). Plenty of vendors and food choices are available.

## LAREXPO: LATIN AMERICAN ARTISANS & ENTREPRENEURS EXPO

### MAY EVENT

Join the festivities at this multicultural event that celebrates Latin American heritage and traditions through art, food, folklore dances, live music, and craftsmanship of each participating country. Artisans are selected for their enthusiasm to promote the preservation of their countries' traditional crafts, showcasing their cultural workmanship. Entrepreneurs attend to link to the community and provide info, advice, and support.

## ANNUAL MANASSAS RAILWAY FESTIVAL

### SUMMER EVENT

Guests come to experience the beauty of Historic Downtown Manassas each June by attending the Annual Manassas Railway Festival.



This family celebration of rich railroad history features excursion train rides, train memorabilia, specialty vendors, model railroad displays, and live performances!

Train enthusiasts may take their love of trains to a new level by boarding one of four scenic train excursion rides to Clifton, VA and back. Total time is 30 minutes. Spend the rest of the afternoon viewing one of the largest Lego villages, along with various working models celebrating the City's culture as a railroad town.

## MANASSAS BEE FESTIVAL

### JUNE EVENT

Get buzzing at this annual outdoor festival on the grounds of the 19th century Liberia House near Historic Downtown Manassas. Bring the whole family to enjoy live music, food trucks, a mead garden, vendors, crafts, native plants, farm animals, and more. The City of Manassas is the first city in Northern Virginia to receive the Bee City USA® designation, bringing awareness to plant native and save declining pollinators. During this event, Liberia House is open for self-guided tours.

## CELEBRATE AMERICA

### JULY 4TH EVENT

Our All-American celebration features the largest fireworks display in Northern Virginia and attracts as many as 80,000 visitors to Manassas. A free event for everyone, the day is filled with live entertainment, carnival food, and children's activities. If the carnival atmosphere is not what you're looking for, then our restaurants offer outdoor seating that provides an intimate view of the fireworks—but make sure to call for reservations.







## MANASSAS AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE FESTIVAL

### AUGUST EVENT

To spotlight African American heritage and celebrate the rich diversity in our culture, the first Saturday in August is marked by this festival, which includes a music stage, classic car show, arts & crafts gallery, history gallery, plenty of food choices, and local vendors. It's a community gathering with representatives from area schools, churches, and businesses. A variety of lively performances will be on stage and visitors are welcome to join in and dance! Location is at Metz Middle School, minutes from Historic Downtown Manassas.

## FESTIVAL SALVADORENO

### AUGUST EVENT

Gather at one of DC's most anticipated artistic-cultural events celebrating the Latin American community. Organized by the Salvadoran American Council, visitors will enjoy cultural entertainment including music, singers, dancers, clowns, and other performers. There is a wide variety of vendors and crafts plus varied dishes from Central America, Mexico, and South America.

## MANASSAS LATINO FESTIVAL

### AUGUST EVENT

Celebrating the cultural heritage and contributions of the Latin American community in our region and nationwide, this festive event offers live music, heritage dance performances, diverse foods, vendors, and plenty of fun activities for the whole family.

## EDGAR ROHR CAR SHOW

### SEPTEMBER EVENT

Get your engines running! The City's annual antique car show draws enthusiasts from near and far. There will be plenty of cars to admire, demonstrations to watch, door prizes, and a silent auction. Event organizer is Bull Run Region AACA (Antique Automobile Club of America) Car Club, which exists to restore, preserve, drive, and enjoy antique and classic cars and car history.

## ANNUAL FALL JUBILEE

### FALL EVENT

Fall Jubilee is another annual event that turns Downtown into one of the area's largest fall festivals the whole family will enjoy. Walk the downtown streets, shop handmade crafts from over 100 vendors, and enjoy homemade food from the best restaurants in the area. Live entertainment will have you dancing in the streets. This free event covers over three-square blocks with games, amusement rides, entertainment, food, crafters, and more. There is fun for everyone during the Fall Jubilee.



## HAUNTED HAPPENINGS

### OCTOBER EVENT

Grab the family and your dog and join Historic Manassas, Inc. & the Old Town Business Association for a wickedly good time in Historic Downtown Manassas. There will be a costume contest along with games and activities. Downtown Manassas merchants also provide candy for trick-or-treating at their respective shops.

## NORTHERN VIRGINIA VETERANS PARADE

### FALL EVENT

Historic Downtown Manassas has been proud to have Vetpar, Inc. organize this parade honoring Veterans and their families. Each year the parade theme honors Veterans from a specific era, conflict, or a branch of military service. Regardless of the theme, it is heartwarming to help celebrate our Nation's Veterans and the organizations that support them.



## MERRY OLD TOWN

### DECEMBER EVENT

The magic begins with holiday musical performances before Santa arrives at the Manassas Depot on the VRE train shortly after 6 p.m. on every First Friday in December. After Santa lights the tree, he greets all the children and listens to their holiday wishes at the Harris Pavilion gazebo. The next day features the Greater Manassas Christmas Parade. This is one of the largest parades in Northern Virginia, with over 100 entries and concludes with Santa welcoming in the holidays for Historic Downtown Manassas. Holiday joy continues to spread until Christmas with holiday activities, ice skating, dining, and shopping.

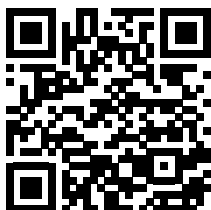

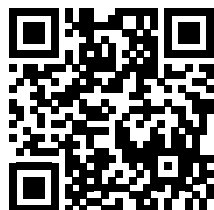

# RECREATION & OUTDOORS

Celebrating 30 years as a Tree City USA community, Manassas boasts numerous trails, parks, pools, and activities to keep residents and visitors fit and outdoors.

## HARRIS PAVILION

The Loy E. Harris Pavilion is an open-air venue right in Historic Downtown. It was built to serve as a year-round events and activities center that converts to an



outdoor ice rink in the winter. In warmer months the pavilion hosts our award-winning Farmer's Market, concerts, ice cream socials, movies, festivals, events, and so much more. ## TRAILS & CONNECTIONS

Manassas has a very high walkability rating, a testament to the City's commitment to being bike and pedestrian-friendly. Enjoy the many pathways leading to unique shopping and restaurants, playgrounds, parks, and historic sites. If you enjoy the



outdoors, a wonderful way to explore Manassas is along the many bike routes and pedestrian trails throughout the City. These follow marked routes, including designated bike lanes along the roadways, leading to 16 parks that are there for you to discover. For outdoor exercise, check out the adult fitness equipment and walking trail in Byrd Park or stroll down Winters Branch Trail to enjoy the beauty of the tree canopy and natural wildlife habitats. Sidewalks throughout Downtown connect to Baldwin Park, a perfect place to stop with the toddlers to play on the four-car train. Bike or walk down Grant Avenue, one of the City's older neighborhoods containing stately historic homes, to Nelson Park which contains a gazebo and garden fountain. ## FREEDOM AQUATIC & FITNESS CENTER

## STONEWALL PARK AND POOL

# RAINY DAY ACTIVITIES

Vacations don't end when it's raining or hot and muggy outside. The City of Manassas offers plenty of indoor activities you can enjoy while staying dry and cool. Some of our favorite venues and activities are listed below.



## VERTICAL ROCK

Vertical Rock Indoor Climbing Center is one of the largest gyms in the country and home to the largest indoor climbing arch. Climbing creates strong bonds and builds trust. Close to some of the most beautiful outdoor climbing and hiking areas in America, Vertical Rock provides instruction and certification to individuals and families ranging from beginner to advanced skills. Top-notch instructors are available to walk climbers through each step.
